Lighthouse SPECIAL EDUCATION

Using a special education program developed in English and offering a highly individualized curriculum, Lighthouse Special Education offers a chance for children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) to reach their full potential and be part of the community. Students who are able are supported through integrated mainstream education.

Though the city of The Hague has put a building at the disposal of Lighthouse SE, the school receives very little funding. Currently, their biggest need is for sensory-development gymnasium equipment and a student and professional library. Though the emphasis of the children's education lies in individual instruction and working in small groups, physical interaction and mental stimulation form an important part of their development.

Stichting Papageno (the Papageno Foundation) was established 14-years ago by Jaap and Aaltje van Zweden to fill a need in assisting children with autism to connect to others through creativity. Using the arts, with a particular emphasis on music, Stichting Papageno's numerous projects and activities help lift autistic children out of their isolation. Equally importantly, they illuminate their true potential. Stichting Papageno's aim has since evolved to include children, adolescents, and young adults with autism and autism spectrum disorders (ASD).

Papageno works closely with schools, research facilities, art organizations, and care facilities. Their current project is Papageno Huis (Papageno House). a residence and job training center planned for autistic young adults. Stichting Papageno receives no government funding and is a nonprofit organization. Financing these projects and programs is only possible through fundraising, contributions from sponsors, and donations.
